

Violence against girls and boys is a chronic global pandemic that afflicts 3 in 4 children each year. Yet violence is preventable, and by working in partnership to support evidence-based solutions, we can help end it.

Ignite Philanthropy's goal is to maximize philanthropy's collective ability to take risks and act boldly to prevent violence and help girls and boys to thrive.

In partnership, we can achieve more together than we ever can alone.

Violence takes many forms: neglect, physical and emotional abuse, rape, inhuman and degrading treatment or punishment, female genital mutilation/cutting, sexual abuse, exploitation, trafficking and child marriage, not to mention the many violent ways in which children die during conflict.² For the survivors, the consequences of violence can be devastating and last a lifetime – often with rippling effects across subsequent generations.³

Violence against children is a serious and costly global issue, impairing children physically, mentally, and developmentally for years to come. It undermines the effectiveness of investments we're making in areas like health, education, and gender equality that should be making children's lives better.

In South Africa, for example, rigorous analysis of the cost of physical and emotional violence against children found the cost may be as high as 6% of GDP.⁵ In every country, violence against children has direct costs for the health care, social welfare, and criminal justice systems.⁶

Ignite Philanthropy is a pooled donor fund created to give girls and boys the chance for a childhood free from violence.

We have an historic opportunity to end violence against girls and boys:

- * For the first time, every country has committed to ending all forms of violence against children as a cornerstone for global development. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) provide the mandate through 2030 for nations to achieve interconnected targets such as ending all violence against girls and boys, eliminating gender-based violence, ending child labor, and ensuring that schools are safe. The SDGs offer a rare chance to energize international, regional, national, and local initiatives behind a universal mandate for action, resources, and results.
- * To build political will, accelerate government action for proven solutions, and strengthen collaboration, the **Global Partnership to End Violence Against Children** is the first shared worldwide platform for stakeholders across levels. There has never been a more auspicious moment for progress.
- * For countries to be effective in preventing violence against children, the evidencebased solutions package **INSPIRE: Seven Strategies for Ending Violence Against Children** offers unprecedented scientific consensus and clarity.⁸

* Build a Robust Global Partnership to End Violence Against Children

The Global Partnership needs to serve as a robust, worldwide platform to consistently connect stakeholders across sectors, facilitate collective learning and strategy, and amplify voices and efforts.

* Fueled by Powerful Grassroots Voices

Authentic children/youth, grassroots, and national leadership must be the heart of a powerful movement that drives the Global Partnership, and creative communications are needed to make their stories visible at all levels.

* With a Strong Resource Base

A strong resource base requires leveraging and aligning resources for the Global Partnership, the associated Fund to End Violence Against Children, country-level implementation, movement and civil society organizations, as well as Ignite Philanthropy.
